President of the Mental Health Tribunal for Scotland

Dr Morrow has for over 35 years been actively involved in the community and civic life in Dundee. He has been involved with numerous charities, community activities and civic duties. He has been a member of the Faculty of Advocates for some years now and took Silk in 2015. Previous to which he was a solicitor both in private practice and in the voluntary sector.
