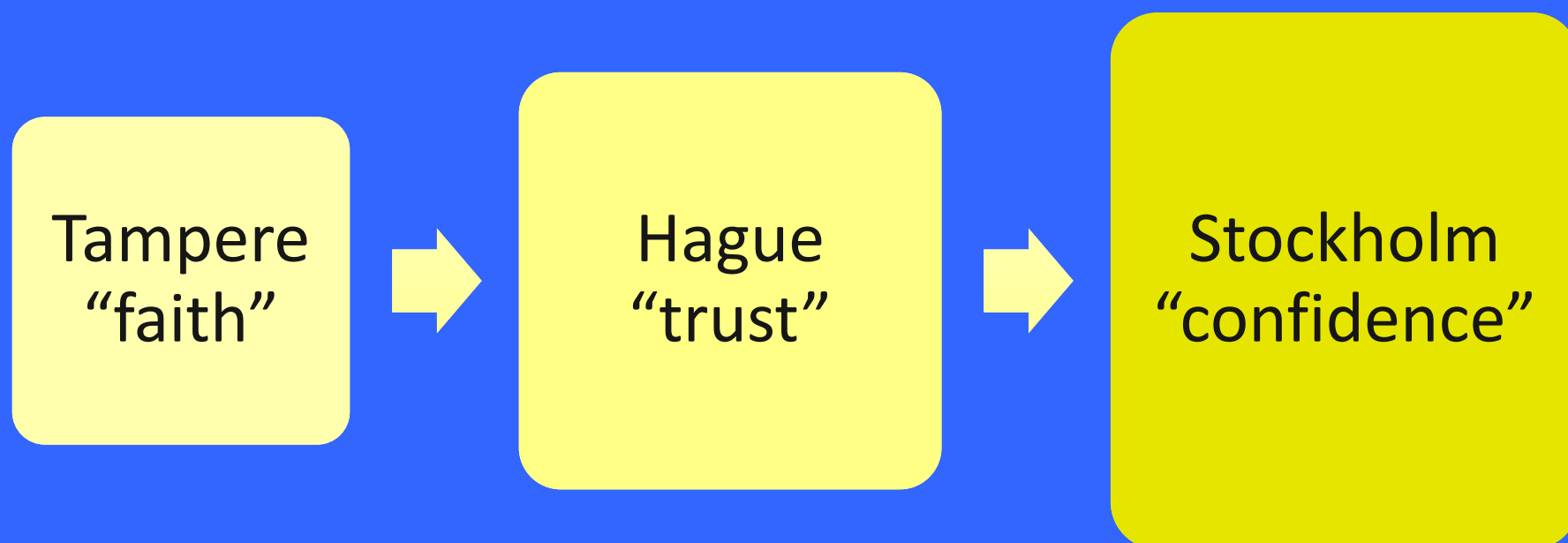
EU milestones

Fundamental (human) rights

- Member States & the ECHR: Articles 2 & 49 post-Lisbon TEU;
- ECJ/CJEU fundamental rights doctrine;
- Article 6 pre-Lisbon TEU;
- Case C-402/05 & C-415/05 *Kadi*; App. No.45036/98 *BosphorusvIreland*

Fundamental rights post-Lisbon

- Article 6 post-Lisbon TEU;
- Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU;
- EU accession to the ECHR, but see Article 218(8) TFEU

But Lisbon reforms not without equivocation...

- The “emergency brake”;
- Subsidiarity check: Article 69 TFEU;
- Opt ins/opt outs;
- The 5 year transitional phase
 - (& the Stockholm Programme)

Who is in the driving seat...?

- European Council;
- Council of Ministers;
- European Commission;
- European Parliament;
- ECJ/CJEU;
- National Parliaments



What does all of this mean for Scotland?

- “Sincere cooperation”: Article 4(3) TEU;
- Scotland as part of the UK: the minority “common law” Member States;
- Scotland *within* the UK & its distinct criminal justice system;
- Regionalism, devolution -& independence..?
